

VISA FEES

Non-immigrant visa	AUSD \$90.00 per entry and AUSD \$225.00 for multiple entries. (for Investors & former Thai citizens)
Tourist visa	AUSD \$45.00 per entry
Transit visa	AUSD \$35.00 per entry

When submitting applications by mail, please include a self-addressed registered Australia Post envelope or arrange for the pick-up of applicant's passport and visa via a pre-paid Federal Express, UPS, or DHL with applicant's account number.

VALIDITY OF VISA:

Visa has a three (3) month validity and as a result, must be utilized within three (3) months from the date of issue. (more than 3-months up to 1-year validity of visa may be granted on a case-by-case basis if more than one or multiple entry visa is issued.)

PROCESSING TIME:

- Applications are usually processed within two (2) working days if submitted in person.
- Applying by mail will take approximately one week plus mailing time.

HEALTH REQUIREMENTS:

No inoculations or vaccinations are required unless applicants have been to an infected area. At present, Thailand requires a *YELLOW FEVER CERTIFICATE* from persons who have been to or have come from the following countries as from February 1991:-

TEMPORARY TOURIST VISA: VISA ON ARRIVAL

- According to the Interior Ministerial Announcements, passport holders from 20 countries may apply for visas at the immigration checkpoints for the purpose of tourism for the period not exceeding 15 days.

- The applicant must possess means of living expenses 10,000 Baht per person and 20,000 Baht per family accordingly.

- The applicant must produce full paid ticket which is usable within 15 days since the date of entry.

- Visa on arrival is provided at 23 designated international checkpoints and applicants should produce the application form to which his/her recent photograph (2 ½ inches) is attached. The application fee is 1,000 Baht.

- Visitors who enter the Kingdom with Visa on Arrival generally cannot file an application for extension of stay except in special cases such as illness which prevents them from travelling, etc. They can submit an application at the Office of Immigration Bureau , Immigration Division 1, Soi Suan Plu, South Sathorn Road, Bangkok 10120. 3.1 Ministerial Regulation Number 14 (B.E. 2535) Issued in accordance with the Immigration Act B.E. 2522

Based on Article 5, Article 12 (4) and Article 44 (2) of the Immigration Act B.E. 2522, the Minister of the Ministry of Interior issued this Ministerial Regulation as follows:

No. 1 Repeal the Ministerial Regulation, number 11 (B.E. 2529), issued in accordance with the Immigration Act B.E. 2522.

No. 2 Diseases in accordance with Article 12 (4) are:

- 1) Leprosy
- 2) Dangerous step of Tuberculosis (T.B.)
- 3) Filariasis (Step that causes disgust to society)
- 4) Drug Addiction
- 5) Third step of Syphilis

No. 3 Diseases in accordance with Article 44 (2) are:

- 1) Leprosy
- 2) Dangerous step of Tuberculosis (T.B.)
- 3) Filariasis
- 4) Drug Addiction
- 5) Alcoholism
- 6) Third step of Syphilis

Note: The reason for issuing this Ministerial Regulation is that at present, the situation concerning AIDS has changed immensely. Prevention of infected aliens or those who are HIV positive into or to reside in the Kingdom has no effect on the spread of this disease within the nation. Thus, AIDS should not be set as a disease for prohibiting aliens infected with such disease to travel into or reside in the Kingdom as in accordance with Articles 12 (4) and 44 (2) of the Immigration Act B.E. 2522.
